## **2 February – Glen Parker Cycles Supa Criteriums - Kewdale**

Hilton and June McMurdo must have been delighted to see the support for their sponsored criterium. The old record of 148 riders was exceeded by ten, 'A' grade with 51 riders witnessed a bunch record, and 'B's' 45 riders must also have been close to a record. Even 'E' grade saw an excellent field of 15 riders, eight of whom were female.

'E' and 'D' grade started off the action. Both groups rode tempo with few heroics, but a fair and steady pace, the few attempts

to get away being quickly nullified by the attentive bunches. 'E' grades event was determined by a spirited sprint into a strong headwind, with honours going to a fast-finishing Michelle McGowan who finished a length or so in front of Bill Crout, with 'Doc' Lawrance on his wheel in 3<sup>rd</sup> place. Serial winner Mick Dunne was 4<sup>th</sup> alongside Lorraine MacLennan and Derek Mayall.

'D' grade saw a similar event to 'E' with the race being decided on the finishing straight, though a valiant attempt was made by Megan McEwan who attempted a break that saw her with a lead of 50metres as she passed the bell. However, being the final lap, the move was more in hope than a reality and she was pulled back before the final corner. With all together as they turned the final corner, it came as no surprise to see the acknowledged sprinters take up the running, and Doug Macdonald triumphed once again when beating Jon Dooner, Bob Stephens, Scott Keating, Pantelis Karagoglou and Andrew Lowe across the line.

The 25 riders in 'C' grade saw a fast pace that curbed the actions of would be breakaway riders. There were, however, a few riders who appeared at the front of the action and who showed some strength in their attempts to break up the bunch. Among the most prominent was Paul Shields, while Patrick Walsh, Brian Buck and trial rider Jonathan West also showed a willingness to stir up the action. As in 'C' grade, the race played into the hands of the recognised sprinters, and it came as no surprise to see a strong finish by Peter Neuzerling when beating Dale Wright, Mick Russell, Steve Ryan, Greg Smith and a closely packed bunch over the finishing line. The two female members of the bunch, Jane Higgins and Anna Kauffman, made a good account of themselves when finishing 15<sup>th</sup> and 17<sup>th</sup> respectively in the same time as the winner.

The large 'B' grade bunch rode an animated race that started with an attack after 15 minutes of riding when Kevin McIlduff opened a small gap. Three laps later a promising break occurred when Antony Bourn and Phil Johnston attacked, to be joined a lap later by Tim Mollison and Patrick Johnston. The quartet opened up a gap of almost 15seconds but a couple of laps later Antony dropped back to the bunch, while at the same time Trial rider Daniel Trinne managed to

bridge the gap to join the trio. Over the final laps, the quartet was pulled back second by second, so that at the bell they held only a six-second lead. This appeared to spell curtains but Tim Mollison survived to finish a close 2<sup>nd</sup> behind Darren Hawley, with Garth O'Leary 3<sup>rd</sup>, Carl Skinner 4<sup>th</sup>, and Mark Anastasaas, Brett Parkes, Mike Andrew and Jaimie Kirkwood sopping up the rest of the prizemoney that went down to 8<sup>th</sup> place. An excellent race but marred by an accident on the 2<sup>nd</sup> lap when Tom Warner went off the road on the second bend and ended up with a broken arm and a ride to hospital in an ambulance.

As expected, 'A' grade's race proved fast and furious and run off at a pace that exceeded 44kph. A break of five riders at 10 minutes set the scene and this was followed by a number of fierce attacks. At the 15-minute mark a serious move by Lee Bolden, Andrew Patterson, and Paul Williams saw them draw away to a 20-second lead some three laps later. Andrew Patterson prevailed when his two compatriots fell back to the bunch but he was then accompanied at the front by Chris Glasby. At the halfway mark they had a lead just short of half-a-minute, but that was then eroded steadily to 10seconds before they were caught on 30 minutes. However, Chris Glasby never says die, and he attacked again before being drawn back. As expected, another dangerous attack took place in the last ten-minutes of the event when John Gregg, Eddie Hollands, Troy Fitzgerald and Ian Gregory posed a threat. Although riding steadily, this was not to be their day and over the final three laps they were brought back by a few seconds a lap to hold a lead of four seconds as they crossed the line for the bell, and an inevitable catch. Despite a fall by Simon Verona on the corner of Valentine and Hazelhurst Road, this had no bearing on the final result, as by that time the leaders were approaching the final corner. In the melee to the line, Adam Fielding timed his jump to perfection and won with a clear lead of a couple of lengths over Brett Stapelton, Sam Smith, Doug Stewart, Gary Wright, Ian Lyne, Richard Kelly and Gary Jones, all of whom sopped up the prizemoney. Altogether, the large

field plus the generous support of Parker Cycles made for a generous pay out of \$2,500 in prizes. June MacMurdo completed the day by presenting the prizes.

However, in some of the grades it was amazing to see breaks going without much effort by those behind to chase, thus leaving the escapees to sop up the points. These were allocated on the basis of 5, 3, 2, 1, with final placings for those on the same points score being determined on a countback.

The events for A, B, C and D grades were the 24<sup>th</sup> event in memory of Jim Thompson who tragically died in one of our races, while the 'E' grades rode in memory of Jim Campbell and of Lindsay Froyland who were equally unfortunate in races on this course. #### **16 February – Criteriums – Kewdale.**

A good turnout of 119 riders and cool conditions made for a good day's racing. 'E' grade with 11 starters saw some steady riding by most of the group. Leaving the verdict to the final straight a reinvigorated Bill Crout, recently back from a lay-off, charged over the line a good length ahead of Mick Dunne, Lorraine Maclennan and Welsh hero Dai

Sankey who has recently fled to the sun from the drowning land down-under.

'D' grade appeared to be in docile mood, though Michael Prinz pushed his wheel to the front on a couple of occasions, only to be brought back by an attentive peleton that gave no quarter. The result – yet another bunch finish, with Scott Keating taking out the honours by a wheel or so. Zoltan Kalotas was 2nd, John Shattock 3<sup>rd</sup>, followed closely by Craig McDonald, Doug Macdonald and Robert Thomas.

The mass of riders in 'C' grade were in no mood to see breaks go and kept a close eye on any would-be escapees. Nevertheless, a few riders were prominent including Ken Harvey, trial rider Ralph Mommoliti and Ben Logan. On the bell lap newly returned Ian Logan (father of Ben) attacked but unfortunately punctured on the back of the course. This left his son to dash up the finishing straight to win by a good 3 lengths over Ralph Mommoliti, Greg Smith, Mick Russell, Richard Barville, Don McCracken and most of the bunch.

'B' grade showed promise of a fast and furious race as Michael Bowles attacked from the word 'go' to open up a 50metre lead at the end of lap one. Michael was chased down by Matthew Swan and Darren Schenk and after another lap they had opened up a gap of 100metres. In the lead for another 3 laps they were caught by Carl Skinner and Justin McGoldrick before leaving the head of the field to Phil Johnston and Stewart Greenan. There was a change of guard when Antony Bourne and Tim Mollison entered the fray just before the half-way mark. With never more than a 10 second advantage, they continued in the lead for the remainder of the race. The bets were heavily laid for a catch on the final lap but Antony Bourn put down his head to drop his compatriot and to cross the finishing line some 9 seconds ahead of Tim, who in turn held off the bunch by about 30metres. Daniel Trinne took the bunch sprint for 3<sup>rd</sup> place and was followed closely by Ben Smith, Garth O'Leary, Ray Lawrie, Mark Anastasas, Brett Russell and the rest of the bunch. There were 4 DNFs' that included Michael Bowles and Stewart

Greenan, who had featured strongly in the opening laps.

The moves in 'A' grade would fill a book. The first split occurred after 7 minutes and this consolidated a lap later when a group of eight riders opened a gap of 25seconds. The group consisting of Ian Lyne, Chad Albury, Magnus Rudisele, Dean Emslie, Peter Hayburn, Anthony Collis, Michael Buytels and Chris Jones stayed together for another 3 laps before they also split at the 19-minute mark. With six of the group still working hard, the vital move of the day came after 33 minutes when Sam Smith went on a solo attack to close the gap from 20 to 5 seconds in one lap. Magnus Rudisele dropped off the back to get Sam into the group and thereafter they held a lead that varied from 9 to 17 seconds a lap. However, at the bell they had a comfortable lead of 13seconds, which gave time for a bit of jockeying. In the sprint Sam Smith proved too strong for his colleagues and coasted across the line for a comfortable 2-length lead. Ian Lyne had a well-deserved 2<sup>nd</sup> place, followed in 3<sup>rd</sup> by Anthony Collis, Eddie Hollands, Paul Foxwell and Doug Stewart who had almost managed to close the gap. Scott Sanders in 7<sup>th</sup> and Mike Pardon, 8<sup>th</sup>, took out the remaining cash prizes.

## **23 February – Hall Cycle Training Supa Series Criteriums**

Another great turnout, with 136 riders facing the timekeeper on a warm but relatively still day, to take advantage of the extra prizemoney in the Supa Series event sponsored by Hall Cycle Training. 'B' grade had the largest field with 42 riders, just a few more than the 39 in 'A' grade, while 'C' had a respectable 26, 'D' 19, and 'E' grade a comfortable ten.

Both 'E' and 'D' enjoyed the cooler conditions and both groups drove along at a fair pace. In 'E' grade, there were a few attempts to break up the field, though the successful move didn't come until the 20 minute mark when Derek Mayall took the

bit between his teeth to open up 40metre lead. Lorraine MacLennan saw the danger and chased hard to catch Derek two laps after his escape. With 2 laps to go they held a 20-second lead over the rest of the field, a lead that had increased slightly at the bell. On the final lap, Lorraine put down her head to beat Derek over the line by 4 seconds, while 'Doc' Lawrence surged over the line to take 3<sup>rd</sup> place, some 45 seconds behind.

'D' grade rode aggressively, with a few riders being notable for their efforts at the head of the field. Alison Ramm impressed with her efforts by heading the field and opening up a few gaps throughout the race. Wayne Gordon was also prominent and their efforts helped turn it into an interesting race. However, in the final and all-important lap it was Andrew Lowe who shone when he sprinted to 5-length lead over John Shattock, Bob Stephens, Doug Macdonald, Zoltan Kalotas and Bill Stibbs who was closely followed by a host of other riders.

Afraid that I lost my notes on the 'C' grade event and having the previous day celebrated a very advanced birthday I plead fading memory for not remembering the moves. I did remember Brian Buck as an early animator and also Micheal Watson and Mick Brown towards the later stages of the event. So apologies for the day's 'heroes' who might have expected a mention. The pace was fast and with no successful breaks it was again the sprinters who triumphed. Corey Freeman impressed with his effort over the final 200 metres when he crossed the line 3 seconds in front of Michael Watson and Mick Russell. The familiar figures of Peter Neuzerling, Richard Barville and Bruce Abbott quickly followed, while first female and 7<sup>th</sup> placed Annie Bramley was unlucky to be one place outside the cash prizes. One other apology, the field rode 30 minutes rather than the scheduled 35mins, something I again put down to fading memory but explain away by saying that I was following our heat policy by shortening the race in consideration of the riders!

The large 'B' field proved energetic and saw some brave moves. The early stages witnessed breaks by both Phil Johnston and Antony Bourn, though they appear to have suffered as a result to finish the race towards the end of the field. After about 20 minutes a

promising break occurred when Carl Skinner, Tim Mollison, Graham Holden and Matt Davis moved away, to be joined a lap later by Michael Buytels and Peter Morris. Brought back after two laps, it was the turn of Chris Peniston to attack, but he too was returned to be replaced out front by Phil Johnston and Jessica Huston who opened up a 60metre lead at the 33-minute mark. A lap later they and Ian Turner were still off the front but decided that enough was enough and sat up as they approached the roundabout at the top of the rise. The next move involved Justin Capolicchio, Kevin Mcilduff, Michael Johnston and Stephen Milford who lasted for three laps but who held only a six-second lead with two to go, a gap insufficient to hold off the determined bunch. In the final sprint the tall figure of Darren Hawley appeared at the front of the charging bunch to win by a clear length over Matt Davis, Ian Mackey, Garth O'Leary, Mark Anastasas and Jessica Huston.

'B' grade's fast and furious race was only excelled by 'A' grade where attacks went off from the beginning of the race. The first serious gap occurred just after 10 of the 50minutes and 2 laps, when Chris Glasby rode to a 50metre lead. A four-lap break was initiated a lap later when Chris Glasby was joined by Chris Beeck, Adam Fielding, Chris Jones, Paul Foxwell, Jeff Brooks, and Doug Stewart. With a few managing to close the gaps the break eventually consolidated into a serious group containing Chris Glasby (again), Andrew Patterson, Jeff Brooks, Doug Stewart and Chris Beeck. Sam Smith joined them after 33 minutes, Scott Sanders a few laps later after a determined chase, while there were a number of others who valiantly attempted to bridge the gaps. With the break moving smoothly, there was some despondency in the main group. While Magnus Rudisele, Ian Lyne and Carlos De Oliveira stayed within striking distance, the main bunch had been left 35 seconds behind at the bell. Chris Glasby finished off as he had started when surging ahead on the final straight to beat Doug Stewart by three seconds, with Sam Smith 3<sup>rd</sup>, Chris Beeck 4<sup>th</sup>, Jeff Brooks 5<sup>th</sup> and Scott Sanders 6<sup>th</sup>. Carlos De Oliveira

of the chasing group was 7<sup>th</sup> another 18 seconds behind, while Ian Lyne and Magnus Rudisele were clear of the main bunch by 5 seconds. Averaging over 42kph this was a hard-contested race on a hot and thirsty day.

Brad Hall helped with the presentation and was no doubt pleased to see a large contingent of his Hall Training Group feature in all divisions.
